Cosmetology Course Outline

CURRICULUM FOR COSMETOLOGY COURSE

The curriculum for students enrolled in a cosmetologist course shall consist of sixteen hundred (1600) clock hours of technical instruction and practical operations covering all practices constituting cosmetology pursuant to Section 7316 of the Barbering and Cosmetology Act.

For the purpose of this section, <u>technical instruction</u> shall mean instruction by demonstration, lecture, classroom participation, or examination: <u>practical operation</u> shall mean the actual performance by the student of a complete service on another person or on a mannequin. Such technical instruction and practical operations shall include:
