POSITION TITLE:	Intervention Specialist (Temporary)

SUMMARY OF POSITION:

Under the direction of Program Administrator, will act as a consultant to staff and students, participate as a member of the educational team to design and supervise implementation of individual and group mental health programs for students with behavior issues; provide training to classroom staff and support personnel and parents; maintain appropriate documentation, records, and reports. Does related work as required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS-EDUCATION, TRAINING, AND EXPERIENCE:

Possess a Bachelor's Degree and a Marriage and Family Therapist (MFT) certificate or license. Experience in providing educational programs and behavior plans to students with behavior issues.

DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS-EDUCATION, TRAINING, AND EXPERIENCE:

Clinical Social Work Licensure

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

Knowledge of:

- assessment, planning, and implementation of positive behavioral interventions for individuals and groups
- current methods and techniques of applied behavior analysis

Ability to:

- present staff development workshops to adults
- communicate effectively verbally and in writing with students, staff, parents, and agency personnel
- analyze student performance, design appropriate individual behavior programs, and monitor student progress
- coordinate work of classroom staff and support personnel
- work effectively as a team member

Possess:

• a valid California driver's license and proof of liability insurance coverage in the minimum amount required by SJCOE policy; insurable by the SJCOE carrier. Must furnish own transportation as required to fulfill job duties.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

Essential functions may include but are not limited to the following:

- 1. Provide consultation regarding student programs to teachers, parents, administrators, and other health support staff including the design and implementation of behavior programs.
- 2. Carry out appropriate assessment for various behavioral problems and learning problems related to inappropriate behavior.
- 3. Provide therapeutic services to students or refer to appropriate service providers.
- 4. Provide staff development training for teachers, parents, and support personnel.
- 5. Maintain appropriate documentation and submit reports as required.
- 6. Perform other related duties as required.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Employees in this position must have the ability to:

- 1. Sit for extended periods of time.
- 2. Enter data into a computer terminal, operate standard office equipment, and use a telephone.
- 3. See and read a computer screen and printed matter with or without vision aides.
- 4. Hear and understand speech at normal levels and on the telephone.
- 5. Speak so that others may understand at normal levels and on the telephone.
- 6. Stand, walk, and bend over, reach overhead, grasp, push, pull and move, lift and/or carry up to 25 pounds to waist height.

WORK ENVIRONMENT:

Employees may come in direct contact with students, parents, SJCOE and school district staff, outside agency staff, and the public. Employees in this position will be required to work in a school setting.

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
