SUMMARY OF POSITION:

Under the direction of the Director of Language & Literacy, instructor designs and delivers High Intensity Language Training (HILT) exclusively in Spanish. HILT is a communication-based, immersion model for adult participants to learn and use beginning Spanish in every day, practical situations. The class is highly interactive, and students engage in a variety of carefully scaffolded activities designed to maximize student participation. A knowledge of language acquisition and scaffolding techniques, coupled with utilization of collaborative strategies is required.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS-EDUCATION, TRAINING, AND EXPERIENCE:

Possess a Bachelor's degree. Possess a valid California general education or special education teaching credential; with the appropriate English Learner Authorization (ELA 1 Authorization, CLAD certificate, or bilingual authorization) authorizing the teaching of departmentalized and/or designated English Language Development (ELD).

DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS – EDUCATION, TRAINING, AND EXPERIENCE:

Previous work experience providing professional learning to adults. Five years of classroom teaching experience using Spanish.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

- Fluent in Spanish and English.
- Principles, practices, theories, methods, educational trends, techniques and strategies pertaining to second language acquisition teaching and learning.
- Techniques and procedures regarding curriculum and instructional design and delivery systems.
- Proper Spanish and English usage, grammar, spelling, punctuation and vocabulary in all forms of communication.
- State Education Code, local, state and federal laws, codes, regulations and requirements and county office organization, operations, policies and objectives as related to assigned activities and/or instructional area.

CREDENTIALS AND/OR UNIQUE KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES:

Bilingual/Biliterate in English and Spanish.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

Essential functions may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Assist and collaborate with Director of Language & Literacy in the design, development, and delivery of teaching content.
- 2. Determine professional goals and objectives through the assessment and evaluation process.
- 3. Prepare and maintain a current work schedule.
- 4. Provide a safe and optimal learning environment conducive to student learning.

- 5. Provide appropriate and creative learning experiences that focus on modeling second language acquisition techniques.
- 6. Utilize instructional methods appropriate in meeting student cultural, academic, and linguistic needs.
- 7. Comply with schedules, policies, regulations, procedures, orders, and directives of the County Superintendent.
- 8. Exhibit professionally appropriate interpersonal skills including but not limited to tact, patience, flexibility, and courtesy.
- 9. Maintain a safe work environment.
- 10. Work collaboratively and maintain effective working relationships with others in the course of work in assigned area.
- 11. All other duties as assigned.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Employees in this position must have the ability to:

- 1. Sit for extended periods of time.
- 2. Enter data into a computer terminal, operate standard office equipment, and use a telephone.
- 3. See and read a computer screen and printed matter with or without vision aids.
